






About the Teaching Guide

8.	What makes <i>you</i> unique?







Vocabulary in Off-Kilta Matilda

Symmetry - when one half of a shape is exactly the same as the other half.

A perfect circle has symmetry.

Prime Number - a number that is divided without a remainder only by 1 and itself.

Seven is a prime number because it is only divided by 7 and 1.

Divisible - a number that can be divided without a remainder. *Four is divisible by* 2.

Unique - one of a kind.

The painting by the artist is unique.

Certificate - an official document


I earned a certificate for perfect school attendance.

Rectangle - a shape with four sides and four corners *The door is shaped like a rectangle*.

Organize - to put things in a special order *I need to organize my books on the bookshelf.*

Embarrassed - to feel ashamed or weird.


I felt embarrassed when I laughed and water came out of my nose.


